Did You Know?

- Children of incarcerated parents again and again speak of their overwhelming sense of isolation, shame, guilt, grief and loss.
- There are over 4,000 Vermont children with one or both parents in prison or somewhere in the Corrections system.
- 50% of all children with incarcerated mothers are cared for by grandparents; nearly 2/3rds of children being raised by single grandmothers live in poverty.
- Nearly 75% of those admitted to state prison have been convicted of non-violent crimes.
- More than 60% of parents in prison are held more than 100 miles from home.

About Camp Agape Vermont

Our history: Camp Agape Vermont started in 2006 at beautiful Covenant Hills Christian Camp in Cabot with 28 campers. In 2007, 49 campers came from 22 different Vermont towns. In 2008 we had 75 campers and a staff of nearly 60 people, mostly volunteers. In 2009, we had 80 campers with a staff of 75, most of whom were volunteers.

Our purpose is to provide a free week of Christian camping for children who have a parent in prison or under the supervision of the Vermont correctional system.

Our guiding principle is to offer the children *agape*, a Greek word which means the kind of love God has for us -- freely given, generous, unconditional, no-strings-attached love. We also offer campers an opportunity to share their experiences and feelings about having a parent in prison.

Camp Agape offers an alternative to the trauma, grief and loss children experience when a parent is incarcerated. We seek to break the cycle of ‘generational incarceration’ which traps so many children of prisoners.

One counselor put it this way: “In that week at camp, I really felt like I was experiencing the Kingdom of God!”

You Can Help Transform Lives!

PRAY for prisoners, their children, camp counselors and staff.

DONATE YOURSELF as a cabin or relief counselor or staff person. Older men and women can serve as wonderful role models and mentors. Free room and board, the joy of helping transform lives, the experience of living the Kingdom!
