DOWNSTREAM is a documentary film featuring the compelling stories of those left behind when a parent goes to prison. Vermont children and caregivers share their experiences, revealing the complex and emotional terrain they navigate.


DOWNSTREAM includes a number of Vermont leaders and advocates whose perspectives help give larger context to the children's and family's stories. Those appearing in the film include: elected and state officials, educators, a law school professor, and a pediatrician.

The film was produced by Brad Salon, of Bear Notch Productions, in association with Resilience Beyond Incarceration, a program of the Lamoille Restorative Center.

Some of the filming took place during camp last summer and highlights Camp Agape and its mission. All nine of the youth that share their stories are current or former Camp Agape campers.

The film has been enthusiastically received by audiences in six screenings around the state this spring. Further screenings are being scheduled for the fall. Later in June, the film may be viewed directly from the website: www.downstreamfilm.com.

♦ Do you know of family foundations or other charitable foundation grant opportunities that resonate with the Camp Agape mission?


GOAL 4: Serve more children



Camping Plans for 2019

This summer, all of our camp sessions will take place at the Bethany Birches Camp in Plymouth, VT.

8-11 year old Camp Agape ~ Sunday, August 4 to Friday, Aug 9 We will be the only program at Bethany Birches that week. We hope to bring 40 campers and up to 15 volunteers. Special programs will include visits from CLiF, Ron the trumpet player, and Kids-A-Part.

12-14 year old Older Kids ~ **Sunday, July 7 to Friday, July 12** Our 22 middle school Older Kids will be housed together in their own shelters, cooking and eating their meals together, but will participate in the activities of the full Bethany Birches middle school camping program.

14-17 year old Older Kids ~ **Sunday, July 14 to Friday, July 19** Our 13 high-schoolers have been camping together for years now. Some will be participating in high school camp, and some training to be leaders and counselors.
